

# The Cost of Assuming the Worst



### Joshua 22:1-3 ESV

At that time Joshua summoned the Reubenites and the Gadites and the half-tribe of Manasseh, <sup>2</sup> and said to them, "You have kept all that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded you and have obeyed my voice in all that I have commanded you. <sup>3</sup> You have not forsaken your brothers these many days, down to this day, but have been careful to keep the charge of the LORD your God."

"Take care that you do not offer your burnt offerings at any place that you see, <sup>14</sup> but at the place that the LORD will choose in one of your tribes, there you shall offer your burnt offerings, and there you shall do all that I am commanding you."

"Thus says the whole congregation of the LORD, 'What is this breach of faith that you have committed against the God of Israel in turning away this day from following the LORD by building yourselves an altar this day in rebellion against the LORD?"

### Joshua 22:24-25 ESV

"No, but we did it from fear that in time to come your children might say to our children, 'What have you to do with the LORD, the God of Israel? <sup>25</sup> For the LORD has made the Jordan a boundary between us and you, you people of Reuben and people of Gad. You have no portion in the LORD.' So your children might make our children cease to worship the LORD."

### Joshua 22:26-27 ESV

"Therefore we said, 'Let us now build an altar, not for burnt offering, nor for sacrifice, <sup>27</sup> but to be a witness between us and you, and between our generations after us, that we do perform the service of the LORD in his presence with our burnt offerings and sacrifices and peace offerings, so your children will not say to our children in time to come, "You have no portion in the LORD.""

When Phinehas the priest and the chiefs of the congregation, the heads of the families of Israel who were with him, heard the words that the people of Reuben and the people of Gad and the people of Manasseh spoke, it was good in their eyes.
