- Longest chapter in the Bible
- 176 Verses/22 Stanzas/8 Verses Each
- Reference to God's Word in all but 5 verses
- All but 14 verses personally address God
- 10 synonyms used for God's Word

God is worthy because of who He is in His Word.

God is worthy because of what He does with His Word.

God is worthy of an appropriate response to His Word.

Highlights from Psalm 119

- 11 - I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you.
- 20 - My soul is consumed with longing for your rules at all times.
- 71 - It is good for me that I was afflicted, that I might learn your statutes.
- 103 - How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!
- 136 - My eyes shed streams of tears, because people do not keep your law.

Psalm 119

¹⁵ *I will meditate on your precepts and fix my eyes on your ways.*
(Renews focus)

²³ *Even though princes sit plotting against me, your servant will meditate on your statutes. (Finds refuge)*

Psalm 119

²⁷ Make me understand the way of your precepts, and I will meditate on your wondrous works. (Engages worship)

⁴⁸ I will lift up my hands toward your commandments, which I love, and I will meditate on your statutes. (Ignites passion)

Psalm 119

*⁷⁸ Let the insolent be put to shame, because they have wronged me with falsehood; as for me, I will meditate on your precepts. **(Displaces anger)***

*⁹⁷ Oh how I love your law! It is my meditation all the day. **(Daily default)***

Psalm 119

⁹⁹ *I have more understanding than all my teachers, for your testimonies are my meditation. (Grows in wisdom)*

¹⁴⁸ *My eyes are awake before the watches of the night, that I may meditate on your promise. (Willing to sacrifice)*
